

Roof cargo box storage guide

Buyer's guide

- **Design**

Since the box will be sitting on top of your car, it has to be made in a way that reduces the aerodynamic flow. If the box is big and 'out there,' there's a good chance it will provide ample resistance to air flow and slow down your car. Hence, go for an aerodynamic design that is compatible with your car.

- **Good storage**

Try to go for a box that has about 15 cubic feet of storage space. If your vehicle is of the smaller variety, it's good to go for a box that has a range between 8 and 11 cubic feet. You can choose whatever size you want. However, doing so also has to work in conjunction with what car you have.

- **Weight**

The storage box sits on the top of your car and presses down. The boxes are generally made of a robust and flexible polymer which is mostly lightweight. However, even with that in consideration, there are many different options out there. The lighter the box, the more expensive it might be. Choose one that works best for you!

- **Additional features**

The storage box can come with a few additional features that you might or might not want. For example, the most important one is the opening of the storage box. Dual-sided openings are quite famous these days and enable the user to access what is inside from both sides. Additionally, you can also look for the customized or stylized box that sit well with your vehicle. Additional features aren't necessary but can enhance your experience with roof storage boxes.

Things to watch out for

After installing roof cargo box storage, you're halfway done with the journey. Traveling with a cargo box overhead isn't as simple as it may seem. For starters, there are a few things you'll have to watch out for. Not doing so might be a bad decision; in the long run, can lead to unwanted consequences. Here are a few tips you should always keep in consideration when traveling with box storage overhead!

- **Beware of the height!**

This is something you have to always keep in mind when traveling with roof cargo storage. Remember, your car is now taller than it usually is. Depending on your box, this may vary to certain levels that might lead to complications and problems when going into tight spaces. For this reason, you might have to plan and be aware of your limitations. Nonetheless, the latter can have its benefits as well!

- **Always be careful with valuables**

As mentioned above, roof cargo storage boxes are made of a material that is extremely flexible and strong, while also being lightweight. Additionally, there are also waterproof and are designed in a way that maximally reduces any chance of water seeping in. However, this does not give you any incentive to lack off and not pay attention to detail. If you have valuables in the bag or something that can be damaged by water, make sure you wrap it in plastic. Additionally, this will also help if it's raining when you have to take that particular material out.

- **Be attentive of any noise**

When driving, rattling and small noises never carry good news with them. Likewise, when traveling with a cargo storage box overhead, you can never assume that everything is alright. Once you've packed everything and are ready to go, pay extra attention to any noise that might be coming from the bag. This noise can result from anything, such as loose packing or riling. If you've pinpointed the source and don't attend to it while you can, you'll regret it later on when your car catches up speed.

- **Pack wisely!**

Packing your essentials and belongings into a bag is almost an art form. You need to know what goes where. If absolute decorum isn't maintained while packing, this might have dire consequences later on. For example, a very profound case of this is packing all your stuff without any particular order. Eventually, all the packaging is a virtual mess, and the weight isn't evenly balanced out. This has the potential to reduce the lifetime of your bag. Always make sure that when packing, all the heavy stuff is placed in a perfect balance so that the riling and the bag aren't subjected to any unnecessary pressure and strain.

- **Use the trunk if needed**

A lot of people argue that once a rooftop storage box is installed, they can do whatever they want with the trunk and not give much attention to what is being put in the bag overhead. They'll try to pack in as much as they can overhead while trying to keep the trunk free for their comfort. Remember, the bag can only hold a particular capacity. This means that after a particular weight, it stops being effective. If you find yourself carrying heavy luggage or heavy items, it's a better decision to use the trunk and let the overhead bag take a pass on that one.
